- 2009** **Dr Peter Mumby**
University of Queensland, for fundamental contributions to our understanding of coral reef and mangrove ecosystems.
- 2008** **Dr Nick Dulvy**
Simon Fraser University, for his research on the effects of climate change on fisheries and coastal communities, as well as threat and extinction risks in the context of improving fisheries management.
- 2007** **Dr Simon Jennings**
Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science, for the development of applied science programmes that have influenced policy decisions both nationally and internationally.
- 2006** **Professor Hal Whitehead**
Dalhousie University, Canada, for significant contributions to the conservation of cetaceans, including the development of behavioural methods of analysis that are now widely used to better understand the social structure of whales and the effects of human disturbance on cetacean social behaviour.
- 2005** **Professor Ian Boyd**
Sea Mammal Research Unit, University of St Andrews, for research that has guided best practice in the management of marine ecosystems.
